

Jimmy Crack Corn

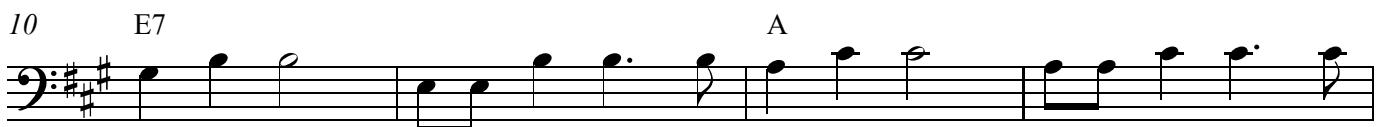
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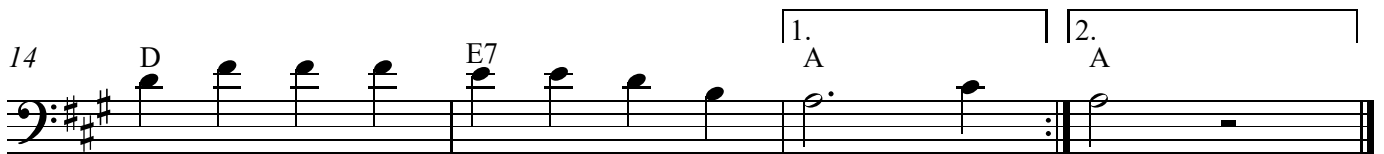
When I was young I us'd to wait for my mas-ter and hand him his plate; And
