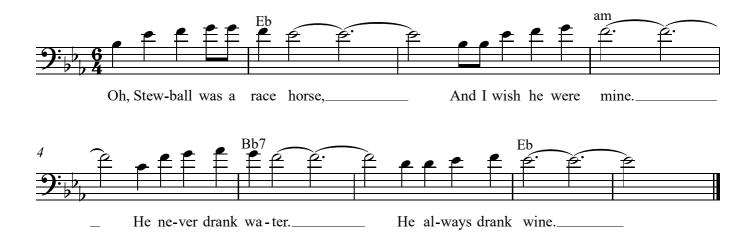
Stewball
